

## SAFETY IN OUR NEIGHBORHOOD

Recently we have had some suspicious activities in our neighborhood. We would like to review measures you can use to keep our neighborhood as safe as possible. Neighborhood safety relies upon the involvement of homeowners in protecting our neighborhood. Know your neighbors and their routines so that any unusual activity can be reported and investigated. Be alert for:

- *A person who seems to have no purpose wandering the neighborhood*
- *Vehicles moving slowly, without lights or with no apparent destination*
- *Parked, occupied vehicles containing one or more persons for a period of time*
- *A person in a car following a child*
- *A stranger entering a neighbor's home that appears to be unoccupied*
- *Any unusual or suspicious noise that you cannot explain, such as breaking glass or pounding*
- *Someone looking in windows of houses and parked cars*

CALL 911 and give your name. Describe the event as briefly as possible: where, when, how and who did it. Describe the suspect: sex, race, age, clothing. Describe the vehicle. Thanks for helping keep Landis Lakes safe!

## OTHER SAFETY REMINDERS

- Do not open doors to people you don't know
- Post a "No Soliciting" sign to prevent solicitors from bothering you in any way
- Never let a stranger enter your home to use the telephone
- Remove valuables from vehicles overnight even when they are parked in the driveway
- Garage doors should be closed and secured overnight

## ABANDONED KAYAKS

There are two kayaks that have been abandoned at the lake. Someone was spotted kayaking on the lake after midnight recently and we think this is associated with the abandoned kayaks. One kayak is currently placed on the dock behind the Marcums' house. Call Steve Marcum at 254-5338 for information if you would like to claim it. The other is currently placed next to the benches on the street side of the lake. Regarding safety mentioned in the previous article, it's important to report unusual behavior of lake usage at odd times or kids trying to walk on the lake when it is frozen. ## SPEEDING STUDY UPDATE

Public Works was contacted again to find out the status of the requested speed study to see if the main road of Landis Lakes Drive would require speed bumps. A new work order was created and a contact supervisor was assigned to this request. Sensors will be placed along the road for a 48-hour period to try and capture any speeding occurring on our primary street. It was requested that the study not start until school has been in operation for a couple of weeks, so that the data analysis would



reflect a more accurate capture of what the typical traffic flow is in our neighborhood. Once the study is completed, a communication will go out if speed bumps are required, and the date and location of when and where the installation will occur.
