

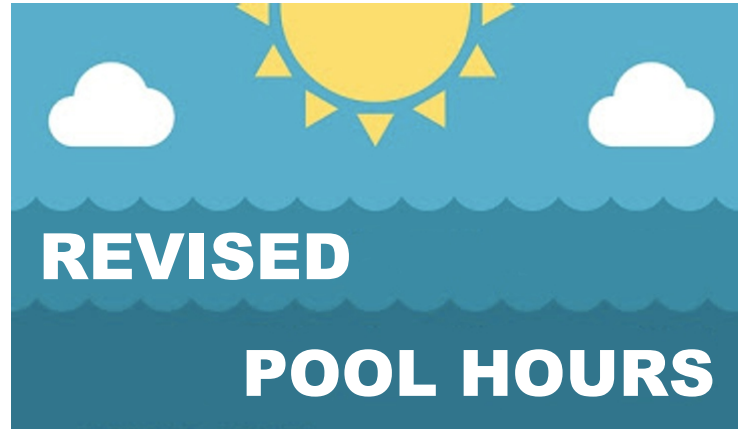


CRIME CONCERNS
